



INFINITY CROCHET

ABOUT

The cable designs in this pattern are worked in a new and innovative crochet method developed by Briana Kepner, which creates clean and beautiful stitching called Infinity Crochet.

All the post stitches are 'floated' on a consistent background stitch that never gets skipped. This allows the cable design to be raised further from the background than traditional raised stitches, and maintains an undisturbed gauge in the main fabric.

Notes

- The chains at the beginning of the round do not count as a stitch.
- Some rows will increase in stitch count due to floating stitches, and then decrease again on the next row.
- If the cables pull in too much and the fabric does not lay flat, simply add one yarn over to each floating stitch.
- If the cables are too loose, take away one yarn over from each floating stitch.
- Cleaner cables are achieved by working the post stitch into (through) post stitches by grabbing two strands of the stitch instead of working around the entire stitch.

Special Stitches

CC (closing curve)

Completed CC counts as 1 sc and no floating sts.

Worked as follows: sk3fs, FFDC around 4th floating st stopping with 2 loops on hook, FFDC around 3rd skipped floating st stopping with 2 loops on the hook, FFDC around 5th floating st stopping with 2 loops on hook, FFDC around 2nd skipped floating st stopping with 2 loops on hook, FFDC around 6th floating st. stopping with 2 loops on hook, FFDC around 1st floating st. stopping with 2 loops on hook, insert hook into next sc and pull up a loop, yo and pull through all loops on hook.

FF3DC (Front Float Three Double Crochet)

Yo, insert hook from front-to back-to-front around post of indicated st (or next available floating st, if no st is indicated) and pull up a loop, (yo and draw through 2 loops) twice. Repeat for remaining two floating stitches to work a total of three front float stitches next to each other.

FF3TR (Front Float Three Treble Crochet)

Yo twice, insert hook from front-to back-to-front around post of indicated st (or next available floating st, if no st is indicated) and pull up a loop, (yo and draw through 2 loops) 3 times. Repeat for remaining two floating stitches to work a total of three front float stitches next to each other.

LC (left cross)

This group of sts counts as 4 sc and 6 floating sts.

Worked as follows: sk3fs (skip three floating stitches), FF3TR around next three floating sts, sc in each of next 4 stitches, working over floating sts just created FF3TR around skipped floating sts.

OC-(Opening Curve)

This group of sts counts as 4 sc and 6 floating sts.

Worked as follows: Skip 2 sc, FF3TR around next sc, sc in each of 2 skipped sc and in each of next 2 sc, FF3TR around base of FFTR's just made starting from top stitch down.



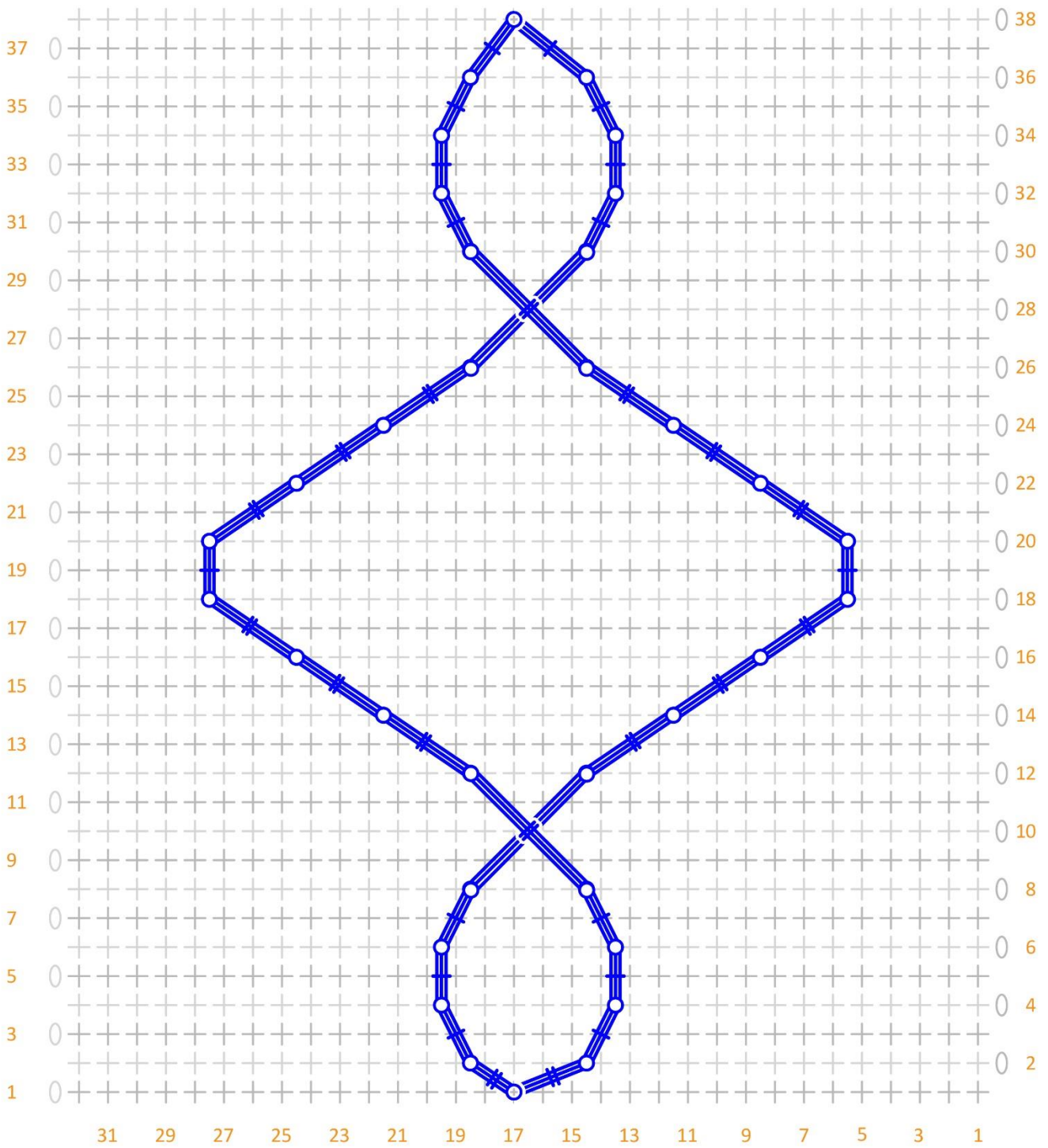
Part 3

1 (WS)	Foundation sc 32 Or chain 33 (32 stitches + chain 1), and sc in second chain from hook and across	32	0
2 (RS)	Ch 1, sc 14, OC, sc 14, turn	32	6
3	For this row and every odd row, sc in each stitch across skipping floating stitches.	32	0
4	Ch 1, sc 13, FF3DC, sc 6, FF3DC, sc 13, turn	32	6
6	Repeat Row 4	32	6
8	Ch 1, sc 14, FF3DC, sc 4, FF3DC, sc 14, turn	32	6
10	Ch 1, sc in each stitch across, turn	32	0
12	Ch 1, sc 14, LC, sc 14, turn	32	6

38	Ch 1, sc 16, CC-counts as stitch, sc 15, do not turn	32	0
Border			
1	Continue to slip stich around the outer edge placing a chain 1 at the corners, join to first slip stitch.		
2	Ch 1, sc in the BLO of the slip stitches around the border of the washcloth placing a (sc, ch 1, sc) on corner stitches. Join with first sc and fasten off, weave in ends.
