Easy

<u>Yarn Weight</u> Jumbo (7)

<u>SUPPLIES</u>

<u>15 mm Circular Knitting Needles</u> <u>Yarn needle to weave in ends</u> <u>Scissors</u>

YARN & YARDAGE

Lion Brand I Like Big Yarn 100% Acrylic, 33yds/250g Shown in Colorways Stucco and Coconut Milk (3 Skeins each color)

<u>GAUGE</u>

2.5 sts and 7 rows = approx 4x4 inches

<u>MEASUREMENTS:</u> 32 inches wide by 41 inches tall

ABBREVIATIONS

k- knit kf&b- knit front and back of the stitch <u>k2tog- knit two stitches together</u> p- purl s(ts) - stitch(es)

Notes & Special Stitches

Looking for an easy and fun stitch to add texture to your fabric? Look no further! Our four-row repeat stocking stitch ridge is just what you need. By combining knit, knit decreases, knit increases, and purl rows, this stitch creates a delightful texture with lines crossing the fabric. And the best part? The decreased stitches also create a slight eyelet effect. Let's get knitting!

Knit 2 Together (k2tog):

With the working yarn in back, insert the right needle into the second, then the first stitches on the left needle (from left to right). Wrap the yarn under and then over the right needle. Pull a loop through the 2 stitches. Drop the 2 stitches from the left needle. This completes the k2tog decrease.

Notes On Sizing:

This Stockinette Ridge Stitch Blanket can be created with any weight of yarn. Simply cast-on the first row in an even amount of stitches to your desired width. Then, work the 4 row repeat, changing colors as often as you want! Get ready to snuggle up under this cozy creation.

Stockinette Ridge Stitch Blanket - Written Instructions

Set Up: Long Tail On or Cable Cast On 50 sts, or any mulitple of 2 for the width of the blanket.

Row 1: p1, *k2tog; repeat * to last stitch, p1. 26 sts

Row 2: k1, *kf&b; repeat * to last stitch, k1. 50 sts

Row 3: Purl. 50 sts

Row 4: Knit. 50 sts

This is a four row repeat for the stitch pattern. Repeat Rows 1–4 and alternate yarn colors when you no longer have enough to complete another row. This will happen approximately every 12 rows.

Bind off in stockinette pattern, weave in ends.
